Honored to Serve features stories on service members, memorials in Greater Washington, and other topics surrounding American forces. Selected segments will be featured at the 2016 GI Film Festival May 21-29 in Washington, D.C. The Honored to Serve initiative will continue through 2017, leading up to the premiere of the upcoming Ken Burns documentary *The Vietnam War*.

Following the *Honored to Serve* broadcast on May 29th will be an encore presentation of the Regional Emmy®-winning WETA television documentary *Arlington National Cemetery* from 7:00-8:00pm; and the live broadcast of the 2016 National Memorial Day concert from 8:00-9:00pm.

Vietnam Remembered – Sunday, May 29, 2016 from 6:30-7:00pm The story of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, and those who make it their care to maintain the Wall.
